

## RING SIZE GUIDE

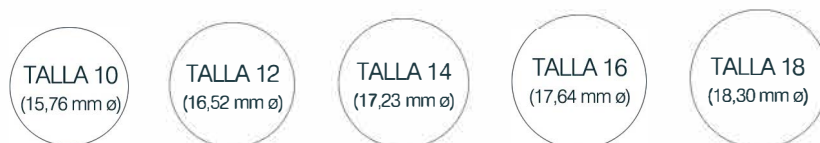
To find the size of your ring, print this page making sure to follow the following printing instructions so that the ring meter will indicate the correct size:

1. Under "Print Options," check that the "adjust to paper size" option is marked "no scaling" or "none".
2. Print this size guide and check that the ring meter has been printed correctly by measuring the bar that appears below. It should measure 4 cm exactly.



### OPTION A: Measure a ring to find the size

If you already have a ring of the size you are looking for, place it over each of the circles shown below, until you find that circle that fits perfectly with the ring. We advise that if you doubt between two sizes, choose the largest of the two.



**OPTION B:** Measure your finger to find out the ring size. Here is a simple way to discover what size you use. Just print the ring size meter below and cut it out. Then, follow the following instructions:

1. Cut the meter and make a small hole where it says "CUT BY POINTS LINE".
2. Slide the pointed end through the hole you have cut out.
3. Place the meter on the finger where you want to wear your new ring and pull the pointed end until the meter fits comfortably on your finger.
4. The number that appears just after the cut slot is the perimeter of your finger. Look for the equivalent to your size in the table below.



Talla 10.- 49,51 mm

Talla 12.- 51,90 mm

Talla 14.- 54,13 mm

Talla 16.- 55,42 mm

Talla 18.- 57,49 mm
